# **CEO Sleepout**

On 13 April the 2023 Vinnies CEO Sleepout was officially launched at the National Museum of Australia, where the 14th CEO Sleepout in Canberra will be held on 22 June 2023.

The event commenced with 2023 Vinnies CEO Sleepout's official MC and ABC journalist, Adrienne Francis introducing the main speeches by Lucy Hohnen and Ruth Wilson from National Museum of Australia.

In her speech, Lucy Hohnen announced the aim for this year's CEO Sleepout and presented awards to last year's top fundraisers and participants who have been supporting CEO Sleepout for more than 10 years.

Recent figures from the 2021 ABS Census have shown that over 1777 people are experiencing homelessness in the ACT, including 399 young people aged between 12- 24 years. With over 3.3 million Australians living in poverty and over 122,000 experiencing homelessness, many thousands of them children - we need to take action.

This year, Vinnies Canberra/Goulburn aims to raise \$800,000 to support the delivery of its services across ACT and surrounding regions to help break the cycle of poverty and homelessness. 50 participants have already registered, and an anticipated 150 of the region's government, business, and community leaders are expected to sleep out this year on 22 June 2023.

In addition, for the first time, regional communities in the areas of New South Wales, where Vinnies Canberra/ Goulburn operates will have the opportunity to take part on the night and connect to the event at the Museum virtually, with funds raised in those locations going to those in need in those locations.

This year, Vinnies is focusing on breaking the myth that only CEOs can participate in the Sleepout. We are encouraging small business owners and community leaders with the heart to make a difference to join the Sleepout.

# **School Sleepouts**

School sleepouts are a great way for students and teachers to put themselves in the shoes of those experiencing primary homelessness while also raising money for people experiencing homelessness.

Vinnies supports people experiencing homelessness or at risk of homelessness through, Crisis Accommodation, Outreach, Case Management and Emergency Relief.

The 2021 census reveled that over 122,000 Australian's were estimated to be experiencing homelessness on Census night, compared to 116,000 in 2016. However, it is expected that the 2021 figure of over 122,000 is an underestimate.

School Sleepouts involve students and teachers sleeping overnight at their school, we recommend sleeping outside to get the full experience. Students can build shelters with cardboard and have a low budged dinner; some schools also choose to invite a Vinnies staff member or volunteer to do a presentation and run activities within the theme of homelessness and or watch a movie. How the night is run is up to staff and the student leadership team, our School Engagement Team is also happy to support you in organizing the night.

Primary schools that would like to participate can hold an evening event including the activities mentioned above without sleeping at the school overnight. By staying at school in the evening students can still have the opportunity to experience the cold and better understand what it may be like to be sleeping rough.
